To Write a News Story, Journalists...

7. **Seek related stories that illuminate issues that matter to the writer and the community**
8. **Use narrative craft such as action, dialogue, & setting to reveal central ideas and evoke compassion**
9. **Engage readers' interests and move them toward a bigger truth, with narrative and information techniques.**
10. **Apprentice to masterful writers by reading work closely and mimicking their craft and structure**
11. **Deepen readers' associations and connections with analogies and allusions**

12. **Investigate the bigger story by researching sources.**
13. **Conduct primary research such as surveys and interviews**
14. **Cite references clearly and accurately.**

15. **Frame evidence from sources by Analyzing and explaining their information**
16. **Organize their writing and use sophisticated transitions to lead their readers across the parts of their piece.**
