Investigative Journalism

To Write a News Story, Journalists...

1. Find drama in the world around them

- In extraordinary, community or, everyday events
- Events that impact us now or in the future

2. Practice close observation, capturing the 5 Ws

- Who , What, Where When , Why?

3. Are Efficient

- Journalists write lean, meaningful, prose under deadline,
- Must capture their readers attention

4. Use an objective tone

They record facts, quotations, and accurate, important details

- 5. Angle the story for social significance
- 6. Raise the level with suggestive details, grace notes delightful jolts, and a unified focus

FIGURATIVE LANGUAGE

6. Alliteration

Repetition of the first consonant sounds in several words.

- Wide -eyed and wonders while we wait for others to waken.
- Betty bought butter but the butter was bitter.
- Slither the sly snake...

7. Onomatopoeia

Use of Words that sound like their meaning, or mimic sounds.

- The Burning wood hissed and crackled
- The words: beep, whirr, click, whoosh, swish, zap, clang bong, boom, crunch, pow, oink, tweet, meow, etc.

8. Idiom

An idiom is an expression that has a meaning that is only know to a particular group of people.

- Kicked the bucket
- Raining cats and dogs
- Bought the farm

Allegory

a story, poem, or picture that can be interpreted to reveal a hidden meaning, typically a moral or political one.

Animal Farm by George Orwell is an allegory of the Russian Revolution that overthrew the Czars and ushered in communism to Russia.
