To Write a News Story, Journalists...

- Find drama in the world around them**
 - In extraordinary, community or, everyday events
 - Events that impact us now or in the future
- Practice close observation , capturing the 5 Ws**
 - Who , What, Where When , Why?
- Are Efficient**
 - Journalists write lean, meaningful, prose under deadline,
 - Must capture their readers attention
- Use an objective tone**
 - They record facts, quotations, and accurate, important details
- Angle the story for social significance**
- Raise the level with suggestive details, grace notes delightful jolts, and a unified focus**

INVESTIGATIVE JOURNALISM

To Write a News Story, Journalists...

- Seek related stories that illuminate issues that matter to the writer and the community**
- Use narrative craft such as action, dialogue, & setting to reveal central ideas and evoke compassion**
- Engage readers' interests and move them toward a bigger truth, with narrative and information techniques.**
- Apprentice to masterful writers by reading work closely and mimicking their craft and structure**
- Deepen readers' associations and connections with analogies and allusions**
